Stude meet hopes to bring out fans from all areas of the region. South Georgia club to attend.

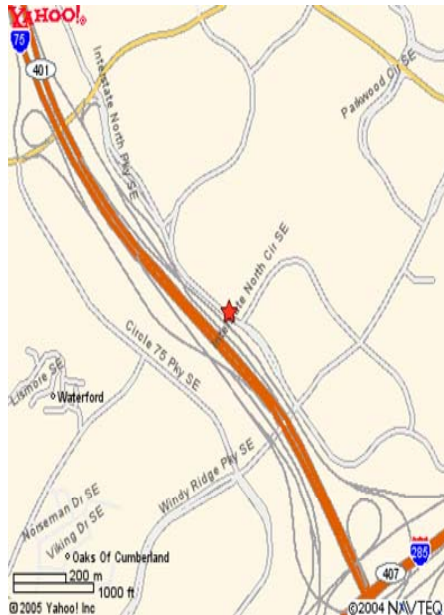

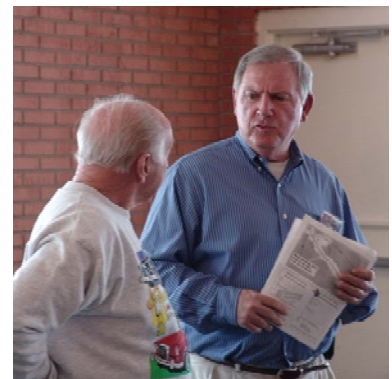

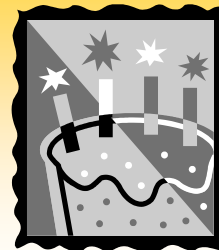
We need some of the new members to step up next time. After this group is finished, I'm sure they will need a break from all their hard work. On behalf of the club, I want to say thank you!
