North Georgia Chapter SDC June Meeting

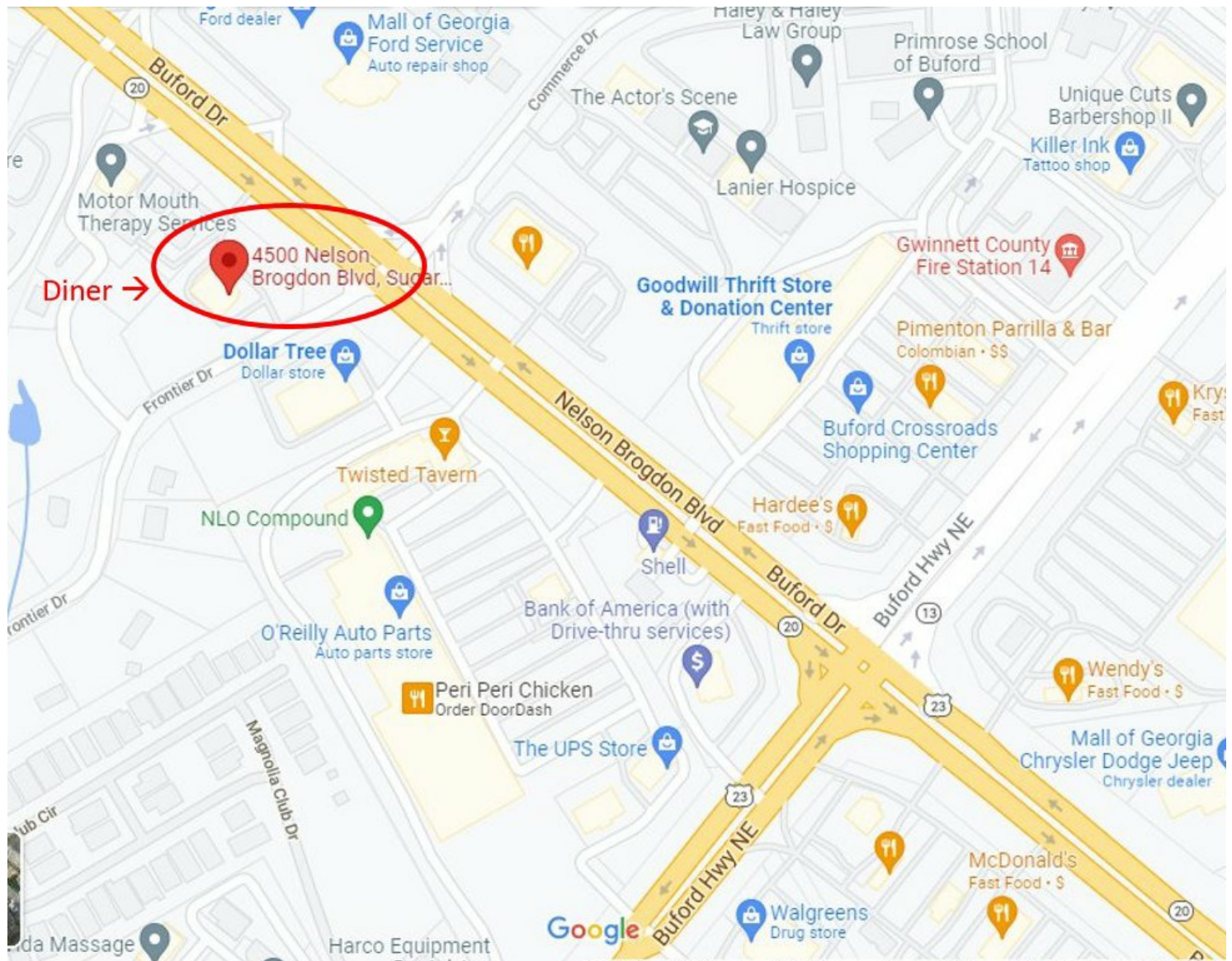
Date: Sunday, June 4

Brake Fluid Testing

Automotive brake fluid does a great job of activating the brake cylinders that, in turn, push the brake shoes against the drum, so we can stop our Studebaker when we need to. However, brake fluid has a downside you need to be aware of; namely, it absorbs moisture from the environment. The technical term for this is "hygroscopic." Hygroscopic is the phenomenon of attracting and holding water molecules via adsorption from the surrounding environment. When this occurs, the moisture content can change the chemistry of the brake fluid, which can negatively affect how well your brakes work. Additionally, the extra moisture will cause the metal in your braking system to begin to corrode and rust.

This hit home recently as I've been helping a young fellow resurrect his 1957 Studebaker Transtar pickup. While jockeying the truck around the yard, one of the rear brakes locked up solid. No amount of rocking it with the engine would free it. This could have been disastrous if we'd been out and about town in this car.

I found that the brake master cylinder was full of brake fluid, but it was a dirty rusty brown color, certainly not what I expected to see. Tearing into the brakes I found the wheel cylinder components were rusty and inhibiting the free movement of the components which is why the wheel had locked-up.

Seeing this I became concerned about the brakes in our other Studes. What I needed was a quick and easy way to check the moisture content of brake fluid. The answer was found in a small device that looks like an ink pen called a Brake Fluid Tester available at auto parts stores and online parts outlets as well, often for less than \$20.

Powered by a small battery, the tester has green, yellow and red LEDs, and two metal contacts at one end. Operation is simple: install the battery, turn on the tester, dip the metal contacts into the fluid bowl of your brake master cylinder. The tester measures the moisture content and lights up the appropriate LED. Before testing the Transtar, I tested an old bottle of DOT3 that's been on the shelf for several years. It lit up the yellow LED. I also tested a new bottle of DOT3 and it lit up the green LED. When I tested the Transtar, the tester lit up the red LED indicating too much moisture in the brake fluid – thus confirming why I was seeing the rust in the brake system.

We all spend a lot of time making our Studebakers look good. Why not spend a minute checking your brake fluid to ensure you and your family's safety?!

CELEBRATION OF THE AUTHENTIC CAR II

MAY 20, 2023

DULUTH, GEORGIA

A Different Type of Car Show!

The Celebration of the Authentic Car (CotAC) was created to showcase authentic, unmodified, and historic pre-war cars. The vast majority of car shows, certainly those held in the greater Atlanta area, now overwhelmingly feature modified and custom cars, most of which are great vehicles. Sadly, owners of interesting, rare, and historic cars often won't bring their authentic vehicles to such events.

CotAC gives authentic cars a show of their own!

Modified and custom cars, hot rods if you wish, represent an individual's personal style, creativity, and craftsmanship, while authentic cars are different kinds of vehicles: accurate illustrations of the wide diversity of automotive history.

All authentic cars, through 1948, restored or not, are invited to enter the CotAC show. The idea is that a car in the CotAC show appears visually as it did when new and also maintains its original style drivetrain. For example, small block Chevy engines or mag wheels on a pre-war car are not authentic features. A '34 Ford with a '41 flathead engine or a Model A Ford with later Ford V8 wheels is fine. The point is that a CotAC automobile represents and illustrates the accurate history of its day and time.

Determination of a particular car's eligibility will be solely at the discretion of the CotAC staff. No one should feel slighted that their car doesn't meet the show's narrow criteria. And please note that the parking lots and show fields are right next to each other, just a few feet apart.

The entry fee for cars accepted into the CotAC car show is a donation to the Southeastern Railway Museum in any amount. Please be generous!

The owners of cars not accepted for the show, and all other attendees, will be asked pay the museum's admission fees, which range from \$18 to \$12. The museum's buildings will be open from 10 AM to 5 PM. Hours of the CotAC show are from 9 AM to 3 PM.

CotAC is designed to be a low-impact, fun event, and therefore **there will be no formal judging.** Several categories of visitor-voted 'People's Choice' awards will be given out to vehicles that remain until the event's conclusion at 3 PM.

Registration and parking lots for CotAC will open for entrants at 8 AM, May 20, 2023. **Note that pre-registration is not required.** There will be food available on the property midday and secured parking for trailers also will be provided Friday and Saturday nights. Details of the host hotel and the trailer parking areas will be provided once these particulars have been confirmed.

The Celebration of the Authentic Car show is held to benefit the 40-plus-year-old, non-profit Southeastern Railway Museum, which is allowing the CotAC show to use its facility without cost. It is consistently voted the most popular museum in Gwinnett County, Georgia. Kids absolutely love SRM!

After the dissolution of the AACA's Southeastern Chapter a few years ago, Georgia has not enjoyed many car shows devoted to unmodified, historic, and authentic vehicles. It is hoped the Celebration of the Authentic Car will find a permanent place on the calendars of enthusiasts who cherish such cars.
