(Note: the 2009 International Meet will be in Cedar Rapids, Iowa during July 12-18.)

- Ed Burris told us that the 2012 International Meet will be in South Bend. The Studebaker National Museum has requested access to the SDC member list, to solicit support for a Studebaker State of Indiana license plate.
- Wayne Lee shared his experiences at the Bristol Speedway last month. This was his first chance to properly "exercise" the 1953 Commander since its completion. Participants were able to make runs of 10 laps around the track. Wayne did his first set at a moderate pace, joined by Ann as co-pilot. Ann opted to watch as Wayne later made a second set of laps at a more robust speed.

- Wayne said that several SDC online forum participants have found wearing their Studebaker club shirts in public leads to opportunities to discuss the cars and the club with new folks. Drive'em and Wear'em! Georgia overall has experienced a net slippage in total membership over the past 3 months.
- Dan Miller told us about a Transportation Expo being conducted at the Richard B. Russell Regional Airport in Rome, Georgia on September 13-14. This event celebrates the 60th anniversary of the U.S. Air Force Reserve with displays of vintage aircraft and a classic car show (car show Sept. 13 only). - At the meeting we gave away the last of our 2007 Georgia State Meet shirts.
- New Club Shirts: Chuck Lampman had two different shirt fabric/style options for members to examine, and we also discussed shirt color and SDC logo color preferences. The option winning the most votes was a 100% cotton shirt, blue in color, with a thin white line trimming the collar edge. Shirts will have the full-color Studebaker Wheel logo, with our chapter name below it. (We voted a solid blue logo as our second choice, should using the full-color logo be cost prohibitive). As we do not yet have a final price from the vendor, this selection was approved pending receipt of an acceptable price quote. We will report at the next meeting if the price quoted appears unreasonable. The club is considering paying \$10 towards the cost of each shirt. Chuck took a poll of size preferences (XXXL, XXL, XL, L, M, and S) to have an idea of what we should order initially. We intend to keep a few popular sizes on hand, since the minimum for subsequent orders is 10 shirts.

Please contact Chuck and let him know how many shirts you wish to order, and in what sizes.

- Charlotte Delli updated us on the following:
 - Presented the Treasurer's Report for July. Reminder: first year dues for new members are only \$5.00 after July 1st.
 - The committee exploring possible uses for some of our excess funds will be deferring any recommendations, pending determination of what the chapter spends to subsidize the new club shirts.
 - We now have 66 memberships, representing 118 people.
 - The new shirt vendor also makes name tags, so we will use them for those needs as well. They have indicated an approximate 10 day turnaround time from order date.
- 2009 Slate of Officers: Per the By-Laws, chapter elected officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, Membership Secretary, and Treasurer) may not serve the same elected office for more than two consecutive terms. As such, the President and Vice President are not eligible for re-election to their posts. The other officers can serve for another year in their present capacities.
- We need 3 members to serve as a nominating committee for the 2009 President and Vice President. **Please contact Barbara** if you are willing to help with this important task.
- Wayne & Ann Lee made a lucky pair this day. Wayne won the door prize, a Studebaker "S" stained-glass window ornament. Ann won \$39 at the 50/50 drawing.
- Ray Downing donated several items of 1950's era Studebaker memorabilia to be auctioned as a group for benefit of the chapter. Jimmy Loftin had the winning bid of \$25.

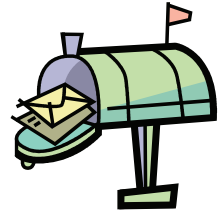

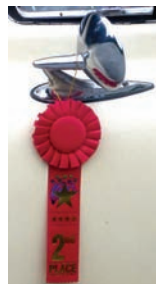
A Fourth of July note by Alan Ziglin

Shrimp Marinade

1½ lbs. cooked shrimp.

2 small cans button mushrooms, drained.

¾ cup vegetable or olive oil.

¼ cup dried parsley.

1 onion, sliced (ring).

1 can pitted ripe olives, drained.

1 small jar green olives, drained.

1½ tsp salt; 1½ tsp pepper.

½ cup red wine vinegar; 2 cloves garlic, crushed.

Mix all the ingredients together, marinade 24 hours. Stir occasionally. Refrigerate until ready to serve. Serves 10-15.

Dear Friends, I am writing to ask for support to represent the Studebaker Drivers Club at the AACA Eastern National Meet in Hershey, Pennsylvania, October 7-10, 2008. I set up our SDC booth at several venues across the country each year and we make a lot of friends, get the word out, and sign up new members. There is none where we get more exposure to potential Studebaker Club members than Hershey. With thousands walking by our booth each day, more folks talk to us than all our other stops combined. We have rented our usual space on the Chocolate Field on "Studebaker Row" and have five tables, refreshments, six chairs and the tent and all the materials we use, gathered up. We will have our SDC banner and likely a Cedar Rapids banner on the EZ UP. Ground transportation and plastic containers to store our stuff have been donated. I pay for my own meals and gasoline. Lodging for the four days is \$377.36 and air fare is \$359.50. I would like for the Studebaker Drivers Club to reimburse me for \$736.86 travel and lodging at an appropriate time in October when the mission is completed.....Thank you for your consideration. April 10 - Studebaker announces production of medium-duty trucks and tractors equipped with diesel engines to begin in June.

May 9 - Studebaker Lark V-8's took first and second places in the 4,100 mile Trans-Canada Rally.

June 1 - Awarded \$21,400,000 government contract for military trucks.

November 13 - Studebaker Lark Daytona selected as pace car for the 1962 Indianapolis 500 mile race - - first compact ever selected.

November 17 - Purchased Chippewa plant from Curtiss-Wright - - 1,400,000 square foot facility.

December 15 - Studebaker International, S. A. formed - headed by A. R. Gale, newly-named president of the division.

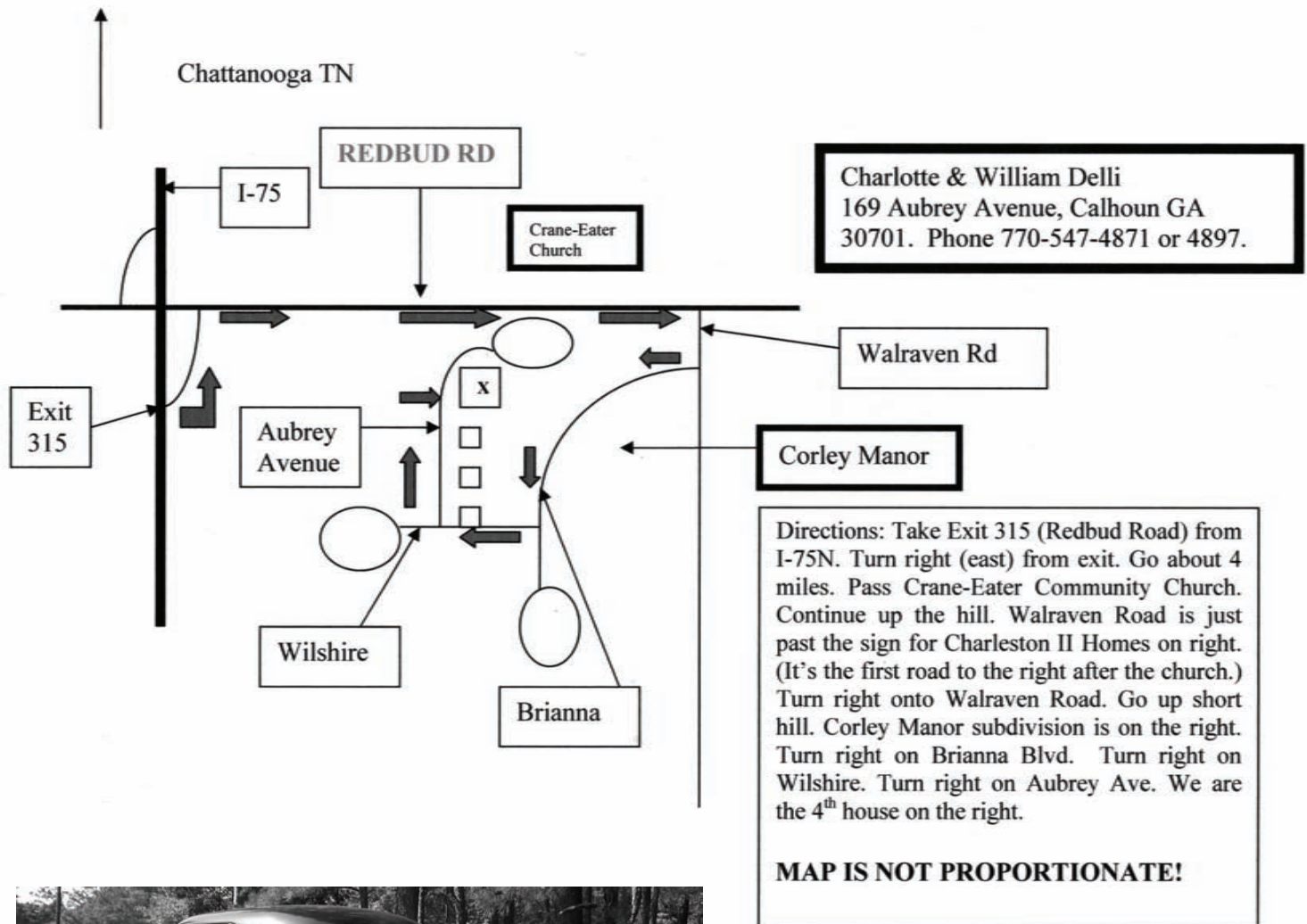

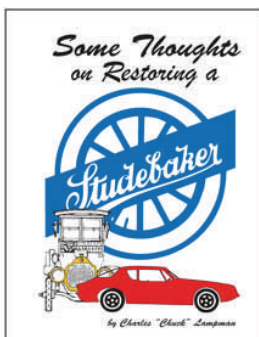

I finally finished it! This is a 99 page book I've put together based on the articles of the same name that appeared in *Turning Wheels* in the early 1990s and which won the SDC's Churchill Award for Best Article, Non-Paid. The book contains all the material from the original series, which ran for a year and a half in *The Hillholder*, and not only replaces some material edited out for the *TW* series, but has updates and several new items that were written after the *TW* series was published.

"Some Thoughts" is aimed at the first-time restorer, but will be of value to the more experienced; it doesn't try to be a "how to restore a car book", but gives you a look at the decision-making processes, tools, spaces and basic skills you'll need to do a restoration, and will provide a framework to help you structure your project.

There are several chapters of Studebaker-specific advice. In the chapter devoted to engine rebuilding, I've tried to describe a step-by-step process that anybody can follow, and included tips I've picked up in building 60+ engines. I've received many compliments on the engine chapter, and I'm glad to finally be able to get it in print.
