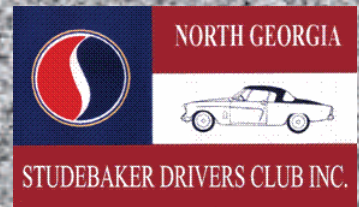

Meeting Minutes

July 13, 2008

- President Barbara Miller opened the meeting. Thanks to Hobo and Brenda Bodkin for hosting us at the parish hall of their church.
- Joining us today were new members Howard Engle of Monroe, and Jim & Dotty Carto of Bethlehem. Our guests included David & Anne Schaffer, friends of the Bodkins, and Jimmy Greene, son of Billy and Ida Greene.
- It was great to have Timothy & Guadalupe Taylor at the meeting, as we have not seen them for some time. Happy Birthday, Guadalupe!
- Ed Burris tells us that we likely will see more color photos in *Turning Wheels* going forward. Under new International Meet rules, the registration fee will be only \$10, with a complementary banquet offered to members on Monday nights. The sponsoring chapter will be guaranteed a minimum \$5,000 profit for its efforts in organizing and hosting the event. With over \$1 million in the Treasury, the SDC will be investing some of those funds in interest-earning instruments. Colin Fort is expected to run for President, along with current President Ed Reynolds.
- Charlotte Delli updated us on the following:
 - Presented the Treasurer's Report for June. Will be in the newsletter. No new members in June, although several have since signed up, bringing our roster count close to 70.
 - The committee exploring possibilities for use of our excess funds anticipates reporting some proposals in August. Barbara suggested The Sunshine Kids, which supports children with cancer, as an option.
 - Chapter calling cards have been designed and were available for display at the meeting.
- Club shirts: Barbara, Bill & Charlotte Delli, and Chuck Lampman will be meeting with the vendor on Thursday the 17th. We expect to have more specifics to share at the August meeting.
- Hobo Bodkin's recent experience reminds us how valuable it is when members take out their cars, thus gaining public exposure for Studebakers and our chapter. Attending such a local event is how Hobo met Howard Engle, who subsequently became a member.
- Dot Hunt passed out flyers for the Jefferson Lion's Club car show. Show proceeds benefit their sight conservation initiative. The flyer will also be in the newsletter.
- Carolyn Sikes updated us on the Vintage Cars, Vintage Wine event being held September 13th at the Hudgens Center for the Arts in Duluth. Owing to fire department restrictions, the orphan car display will be limited to 16 cars total. Rick Kamen is working with the event coordinator as she determines what cars she will invite to attend from the various clubs. With only 16 cars allowed, we do not expect more than 4 openings. Carolyn will let us know more details as they become available.

2 cans ranch-style beans
1 large onion
2 cans cream of chicken soup
1 pkg. sliced cheese
1 can Rotel brand tomatoes
1 pkg. frozen tortillas (12) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Chop onion and brown with ground meat. • Line baking dish with half of the tortillas. • Add a layer of meat & onion, using half of the meat mixture. • Next, add a layer of cheese, then a layer of beans. • Add a layer of tortillas, using the remaining half of the package. • Then add a layer of meat mixture, using the remaining half as prepared. • Mix together the chicken soup and the Rotel tomatoes, pour on top of the Mexican dish. • Heat in a 350 degree oven until hot and bubbly. |

February 24 - Opened Studebaker car & truck assembly in Arica, Chile.

March 3 - Acquired Gravely Tractors, Inc. of Dunbar, West Virginia. Manufacturers of self-propelled outdoor power tools for lawn, garden, farm, and commercial uses.

Cars Magazine 1960 Best Buy Award presented to the Studebaker Lark.

September 2 - Clarence Francis elected board chairman and chief executive officer.

September 6 - Acquired Clarke Floor Machine Co. of Muskegon, Michigan. Manufacturers of floor maintenance equipment.

September 29 - Studebaker-Packard dealers to present "Mr. Ed" television show.

October 6 - Acquired D. W. Onan & Sons, Inc. of Minneapolis, Minnesota. Builder of electric generating plants.

December 28 - Sherwood H. Egbert elected president and chief executive officer of Studebaker-Packard, effective February 1, 1961.

1961:

February 15 - Two Studebaker Larks placed first and second in Class IV of the Pure Oil Economy Trials for 8-cylinder U. S. made cars.

February 24 - Studebaker-Packard announced that seat belt anchors will be provided on all passenger cars. The Lark is the only compact equipped with full safety padded dash as standard equipment on all models.

March 1 - Acquired Chemical Compounds Inc. of St. Joseph, Missouri. Processors and distributors of motor oil and fuel additives. [*Editor's Note:* later known as STP.]

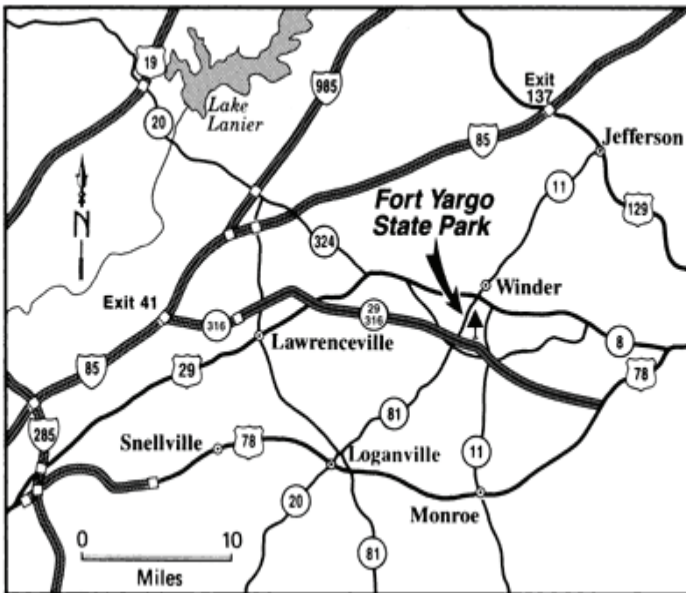

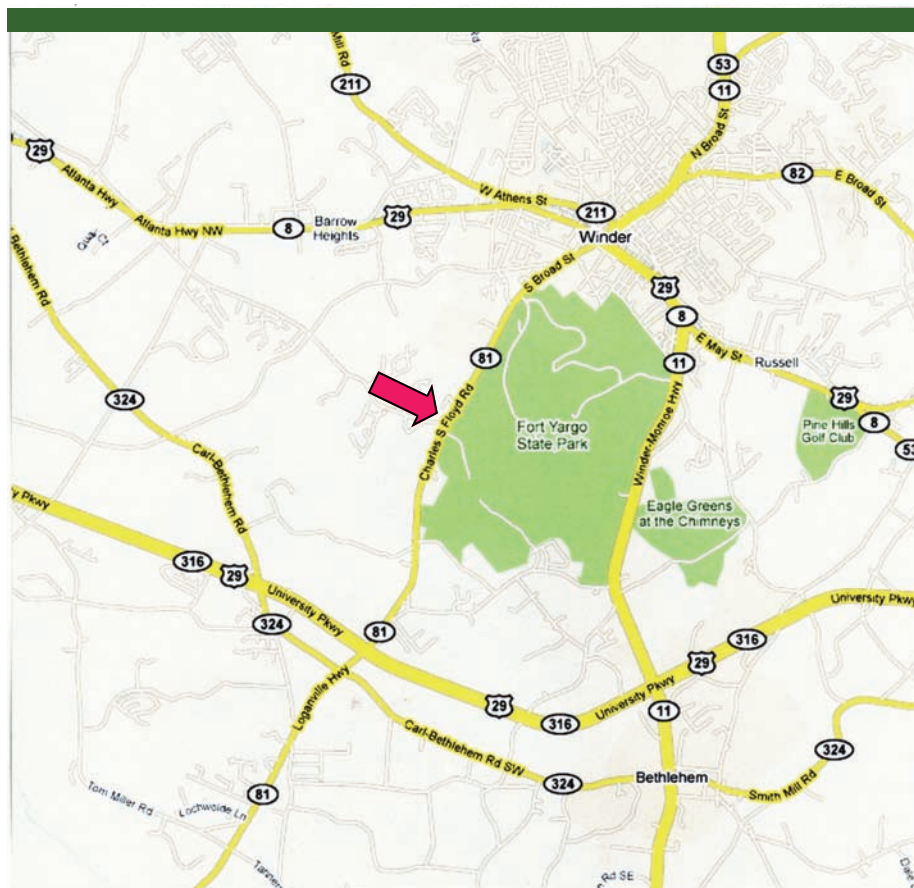


When: Sunday August 3, at 2:00 PM

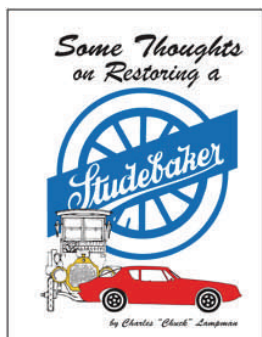

I finally finished it! This is a 99 page book I've put together based on the articles of the same name that appeared in *Turning Wheels* in the early 1990s and which won the SDC's Churchill Award for Best Article, Non-Paid. The book contains all the material from the original series, which ran for a year and a half in *The Hillholder*, and not only replaces some material edited out for the *TW* series, but has updates and several new items that were written after the *TW* series was published.

"Some Thoughts" is aimed at the first-time restorer, but will be of value to the more experienced; it doesn't try to be a "how to restore a car book", but gives you a look at the decision-making processes, tools, spaces and basic skills you'll need to do a restoration, and will provide a framework to help you structure your project.

There are several chapters of Studebaker-specific advice. In the chapter devoted to engine rebuilding, I've tried to describe a step-by-step process that anybody can follow, and included tips I've picked up in building 60+ engines. I've received many compliments on the engine chapter, and I'm glad to finally be able to get it in print.
