

2 Miles, Only 5 Minutes

There is an Internet site called MapQuest, which is designed to give driving directions. You enter your starting address and destination and, in addition to giving directions, it lets you know how long the trip is both in distance and time.

When I put my home address and the late Bill Tilden's address into MapQuest, I find that his house is just 2 miles, only 5 minutes away. That's how close I have lived to him for the last 30 years.

I was fortunate enough to spend time with Bill, making contact with him only in recent years. I was able to help with a few minor activities such as helping move some of his vehicles. This provided me an opportunity to talk with him and hear about his personal involvement in the auto industry as well as his thoughtful views on any number of additional topics. I also learned that there is a real possibility that he was responsible for converting the Nash dealership owned by two of my uncles in Baltimore MD into a Chrysler dealership.

Bill was a genuine fountainhead of automotive knowledge. For example, when I was considering buying a Kaiser located in North Georgia, I showed him a picture of the vehicle identification plate located on the firewall. Without consulting any reference documents, he decoded all of the information for me.

I am comforted to know that he no longer has to deal with his failing health and I am truly fortunate to have had the opportunity to spend time with Bill...but I can't help but think how much more I could have learned from him over the last 30 years.

After all, he was just 2 miles, only 5 minutes away!

December 20th marked the 50th anniversary of the closing of the Studebaker operations in South Bend IN when the last Studebaker—a 2 door hardtop—rolled off the assembly line. After 61 years of automotive production in South Bend, Studebaker shifted the remnants of its operation to Hamilton Ontario Canada where it continued until March 16, 1966.

But, the Studebaker legacy lives on with SDC Chapters like North Georgia that are dedicated to keeping the dream alive. What did you do with your Studebaker today?


STUDEBAKER SPOTLIGHT DESIGN A STUDEBAKER



The pictures of the first place winner and the runner up for Age 21 and over are shown on page 1 of this newsletter. The winners from the other categories are shown below.





TECHNICAL TOPICS

(The following Technical Topic is reprinted with permission from the December 2013 issue of the Big Sky Bulletin, the newsletter of the Yellowstone Chapter, Bernie Harris, Editor)

Old Man Winter is Comin'

Winter is coming. Without going through all the do's and don'ts that most people should know by now, here are a few suggestions that folks may not necessarily remember:

- 1) If you flushed your cooling system, remember to run some antifreeze through the heater core. If you do not, it will freeze and the core will burst.
- 2) Remember, for all those with generators and distributors with "oilers," now is the time to give them a squirt of oil. According to the shop manual, you are suppose to do this once a year for every 20,000 miles.
- 3) For those of you who have exposed type heater cores that will allow leaves and debris to enter, you need to keep them cleaned out so that air passage is not impeded.
- 4) Batteries take their toll in winter. Make sure yours is "topped off" with distilled water and fully charged.

In addition,

- a) If your car had water leaks into the cab, take time to dry the carpets before storing the car for winter.
- b) Leave a slight gap between the glass on the doors and the frame to allow air to get into the car. If the side vents work and have screens on them, they may be left open. The screens are necessary to keep mice from entering the car.
- c) Start and run engine periodically and operate until engine is full operational temperature. While this is happening, pump on the brake pedal to move the pistons and cups in the master and wheel cylinders to prevent corrosion from actively taking place in the cylinders. Remember, what is happening inside the cylinders is not visible from the outside.
- d) If you are parking your car in an underground parking area where there are many cars coming and going throughout the course of the day, the exhaust from the cars will cause deterioration on your Stude's chrome. The unburned carbon plus the moisture in the air creates acid to attack the chrome. You have a choice 1) Wipe the chrome often to keep it clean, or 2) Apply a coating to protect the chrome. FLUID FILE, a bit messy

but claims to be a rust and corrosion inhibitor and CRC also has a product that may be suitable. Wax or chrome wax also will work.

Some car collectors believe that fertilizer should not be stored in the garage with cars. They think that the presence of the fertilizer causes chrome to deteriorate.

Lots of new cars to look over, interesting new people to meet and usually plenty of activities, good meals, parts vendors, etc. I hope to do a better job of this in 2014 and envy friends like the Lee's and Edward Burris who are able to experience so many of these great events!

Well, I suspect that's enough to get everyone thinking. Have a wonderful Holiday and let's strive for an even more productive and more enjoyable SDC year in 2014! See you in January.



SOME THOUGHTS ON RESTORING A STUDEBAKER.

Written by Chuck Lampman, this 99 page book is based on articles written by Chuck Lampman, North Georgia Chapter SDC member, that appeared in *Turning Wheels* in the early 1990's and won the SDC Churchill Award for Best Article, Non-paid. Some material edited out of *Turning Wheels* is included in the book as well as updates and several new items written after the *TW* series was published.

"Some Thoughts" is aimed at the 1st

time restorer but will be of value to the more experienced. It also provides a framework to help structure a project and contains several chapters of Studebaker-specific advice.
