YOU JUST CAN'T KEEP A GOOD VINTAGE CAR LOVER DOWN

North Georgia Chapter member Alan Ziglin has been incapacitated for the past few months by surgery to both feet, which has resulted in a lot of pain for him. He has been virtually homebound during this time. As you have read in articles that Alan has written over the past four years for this newsletter, he had a wish list of cars that he wanted to add to his stable of cars that currently includes three Studebakers—a 1929 Commander (Stu), a 1951 Commander Starlight Coupe (Bullet) and a 1984 Avanti—plus a vintage 1952 Chevy Bel Air and several vintage Pontiac's. The lure of adding one more car from his wish list was enough to inspire Alan to ignore his physical condition and find just one more vintage car. His story follows below.

"The only thing that I was really lacking in my car collection was one with a 4-on-the-floor manual transmission. I have been aware for years that there is an auction in Raleigh NC twice a year where many of the cars are survivors (which I like). Rochelle and I have lifelong friends going back to Graduate School days in the very early 1970's who live in Raleigh. I have tried to get to one of the auctions and to visit with our friends for the last couple years, but it never worked out. As we planned our 2015 travel plans (old cars and otherwise), we said we would go to Raleigh in June 2015. As things turned out with my foot issues, we have canceled over half of what we had planned to do so far this year, but Raleigh seemed like a trip to keep since if we got half way there and my foot was not tolerating the trip well enough, we could simply turn around and come back home.

In past years, the auction catalogue has often had survivor cars I would have loved to have. The catalogue for June 2015 had lots of interesting cars but none that I really wanted to own. That was fine since I wanted to go and see how the auction was handled so I'd know for the future if a car came up that I was especially interested in. Well, as it turned out, a car was offered that was not in the catalogue. A 1968 Pontiac Grand Prix 2-door hardtop with the larger 428 engine; 3 two barrel carburetors; and a 4-on-the-floor. It had been restored some time back and while it needs some work, as I have now gone over the car carefully with my mechanic, it appears I got a very good car. This is the last year for the full size Grand Prix's. In addition, it comes with lots of documentation, including a GM document specifying there were only 195 of these cars produced !!

So, I now own three cars with clutch pedals (Stu, Myrtle and the new one) which I cannot drive because of my left foot problems...but all the more reason to get past this frustrating period and back on my feet. (Literally!)"

(Editor's Note: The new Grand Prix went into the shop shortly after Alan got it. But, as he says, "Why not since I can't drive it.")

TECHNICAL TOPICS

This month's Technical Topic is an excerpt from the "Odds N Ends" column written by Pete Yuen. Mr. Yuen is a retired newsletter editor and writes his column for other SDC newsletter editors.

Erratic Steering

There are two reasons for erratic steering on a car, the first being caused by a driver who had been partying too much or it may be a problem of mechanical nature. The first problem could be solved with a police officer. We will look at the other causes, mechanical in nature.

Erratic steering on our Studes if it is equipped with a Center Pin steering system as used in the GT Hawks, Larks and basically the Studebakers with the independent front suspension from 1950 through the rest of the years of production, can be caused if the bolt (Keeper) which binds and locks the bell crank on to the center pin is loose or insufficiently tightened. **The bolt on the bell crank should not be replaced with another bolt of the same size unless it has the same strength, Grade 8.** The original bolt has the 6 of 8 strikes or marks radiating to the outer edges of the hexagon head. This denotes or identifies a bolt with a tensile strength of approximately 180,000 pounds per square inch. The Grade 5 bolts that are most commonly used on cars have 3 strikes on the head. Its rated strength is 120,000 PSI. The bolts without strikes on the heads are Grade 2 bolts and have a tensile strength of 64,000 PSI.

Excessive wear on the center pin and/or the bearings or bushings can cause the car to steer improperly also. If the center pins were well lubricated, especially in the '62 and earlier models that had needle bearings, they would last thousands and thousands of miles. The '63 and later models of Studebakers used bushings in the center pin

assembly. These assemblies are considered inferior to the ones used in the preceding models. The assemblies are interchangeable. Parts numbers 155437 and 1542212.

Much of the premature wearing of the pin is due to the assembly being overlooked or ignored when the car gets a lube job. If you are handy around the car, you could do the lubrication yourself.

The grease fitting is located in the middle of the front cross member of the frame and found on the engine (inboard) side of the member.


Motion to adjourn by Vicki Green, seconded by Bill Delli, at 3 p.m. Motion carried.





more experienced. It is not intended to be a "how to restore" book but gives a look at the decision-making processes, tools, spaces, and basic skills needed to do a restoration. It also provides a framework to help structure a project and contains several chapters of Studebaker-specific advice.
