TECHNICAL TOPICS

The following article is reprinted with permission from the August 2014 issue of *The Hill Holder* (same name different spelling as the North Georgia Chapter newsletter), the newsletter of the Texas Hill Country Chapter SDC, Mark Brians, temporary Editor at the time and author.

This time I am looking at radiators, as in a 1954 Commander coupe I am working on that is notorious for being hard to keep cool.

Finding a radiator shop to rebuild your old radiator is getting more difficult. The core part of the radiator is also getting harder to find. The brass tanks are getting brittle after 50+ years and most radiators built before 1955 were not made to have a pressure cap over five to seven pounds. The last radiator I had a three row core put in cost over \$400. If you think you can have a 50+ year old radiator just cleaned and run it, you are asking for trouble.

There are new aluminum radiators out there that you can fit into your car or truck. Some are under \$200, while custom built ones run more. With some work I put one in my '55 pickup for under \$200 that has twice the cooling power of the original, but it did take some doing.



I started to put a universal unit in the '54 coupe but decided it was a real mess and stopped. I did some more searching and found a place that is making a new aluminum radiator that looks like the stock radiator and bolts right in with no modification. The stock radiator had three rows of 1/2 inch tubes spaced on 1/2 inch centers. The new one has two one inch tubes spaced on 3/8 centers which gives me more flow and more tubes. It even has a built in five tube transmission cooler. It can handle a twenty pound radiator cap, although I expect to run a 13 pound cap. The company that is building it sent me drawings of what I wanted for approval before building it. I emailed pictures of the old unit to them. I changed the neck sizes a little to make hoses easier to fit. The price is not cheap, but I have a limited amount of hair left to pull out messing with it. Cost was \$529 for this application from Wizard cooling, Ph: 716-655-6760. They have already reproduced a very large number of different radiators. Did I mention they are made in America? Yes, there is still something not made in China. There are several other companies out there that do the same thing. Prices vary all over the place depending on whether is's off the shelf or custom made. Another shop quoted me \$600 to \$700 for the same radiator.

I have decided that if you are adding air to our old cars, cooling is very important to make it work well, along with insulation and sealing up the cabin. Your engine's health is very dependent on proper cooling also, and we all know how expensive they can be to fix. Remember that you car is only as good as its weakest part. I spend lots of time and money redoing lash up's done to cheap it out or just to get it done and going. I guess I am just picky and hate walking. Keep those cars going and the shiny side up.###

THE GEORGE BUGG CAR COLLECTION

If you missed the November Meeting of the North Georgia Chapter SDC and the visit to the George Bugg Car Collection, you missed a great event. Not only was there row after row of pristine vintage cars (arranged in chronological order) and never ending shelves of memorabilia and signs on the wall, but Mr Bugg himself, sharing his history of everything in his collection, made this a not-to-forget occasion.

George Bugg started his collection about twenty years ago. He purchased a vintage car, intending it to be his only one, and the collection just grew from there. Mr. Bugg just loves old cars.. Now he has 130 vehicles. The oldest is a 1912 Ford. The youngest are cars from the 1960's, including many Studebakers and the last 1964 Daytona convertible to roll off the Studebaker assembly line in South Bend. Every car in his collection is in pristine condition. They look like they just came from the dealer's showroom. All of the cars were in this mint condition when Mr. Bugg purchased them.

Many of the product signs that line the walls of the building are reproductions painted by a friend of Mr. Buggs. He takes a picture of the sign he wants to the artist and it is replicated exactly as the original sign.

The Bugg Collection has a full time mechanic on duty. It is his job to keep the vehicles in tiptop condition. He starts the vehicles and runs the engines at least once every three months. (Lucky fellow he. I would like a job like that!)



"Some Thoughts" is aimed at the first time restorer but will be of value to the

more experienced. It is not intended to be a "how to restore" book but gives a look at the decision-making processes, tools, spaces, and basic skills needed to do a restoration. It also provides a framework to help structure a project and contains several chapters of Studebaker-specific advice.
