COMPARED TO WHAT?

A jazz musician named Brian Auger recorded a song entitled, "Compared to what?".

I find the title interesting. Whether we think about it or not, most of the time when we use words like fast, great, old and many others, we are really making a comparative statement. For example, if we hear that a person is 110 years old, most people would think, "Wow, that's a really long time." Of course they would be right as long as we are thinking about how long people usually live. However, 110 years is not very long if we are comparing those years to the age of solar system, which is billions of years old.

Another example is that Rochelle used to work with a woman whose husband was heavily into sailboat racing. I once asked him if he ever took his boat out on the lake just to cruise around and enjoy the day. He immediately indicated that he never did that. He explained that if you are out on a sailboat and are not racing, there is no way to know if you are going fast or slow. What he was saying was that "fast" and "slow" are relative terms.

Comparisons are more meaningful if it is clear what we are making the comparison to. Personally, I am very impressed with the Studebaker Drivers Club and its monthly magazine, *Turning Wheels*. However, I only belong to three other clubs besides SDC (Antique Studebaker Club, Pontiac Oakland Club International and Antique Automobile Club of America). Of those, the only club other than SDC, that focuses on just one make of car and has a monthly magazine, is the Pontiac Oakland Club. (Oakland is the car that Pontiac evolved from.) So it occurs to me that I don't have a very broad knowledge of how good other car club magazines are and therefore, my opinion on *Turning Wheels* might, or might not, be very realistic.

For this reason, I am always interested when an opportunity arises for me to see how others view *Turning Wheels*. Such an opportunity occurred last December. In the December 2010 issue of *Smoke Signals* (the monthly magazine of the Pontiac Oakland Club), Alan Mayes (in his column as Vice President of the club) used *Turning Wheels* as a point of reference.

With his kind permission and that of the magazine editor (Don Keefe), I am reprinting the opening part of his column.

"Every major car club in the nation has a club magazine/newsletter. That's the main way the club communicates and usually the club magazine is its chief recruiting tool. There are some really good club magazines out there and some that are nothing to brag about, though they still serve their purpose.

Besides POCI, I belong to the Studebaker Drivers Club and the Riviera Owners Association. Though I no longer own a Studebaker, I retain my SDC membership just to get the magazine, *Turning Wheels*. It's that informative, with lots of great old Studebaker history articles (and if I hit the Powerball, I'm going to buy an Avanti and a Hawk!). I still have a Riviera, a 1964 model."

I think we can consider Mr. Mayes' opinion an informed one, as he also states:

"Over the years, I have belonged to several different brand or model-specific national car clubs as well as some multi-make clubs, based on cars I happened to own at the time. At one time or another I have belonged to the International Edsel Club, the Falcon Club of America, the Packard Club, Kustoms of America, and the Antique Automobile Club of America. Besides the SDC and ROA, I am currently a member of Goodguys Rod & Custom Association, National Street Rod Association, Kustom Kemps of America, and the Society of Automotive Historians."

My conclusion from all the above is that (just as we are proud of *The Hillholder*—our award winning chapter newsletter)—we also have good reason to be proud of *Turning Wheels*.

October 1, 2011

- President Alan Ziglin called the meeting to order. Thank you to Ben & Janet Alspach and Wayne & Ann Lee for hosting us today.
- It was good to see new member Dave Clackum, as well as Ron and Arlinda Martinez, who we have not seen in a while. We had one guest; Ken Spenski, a friend of Pete McCaffrey's.
- Motion to approve the minutes of the September meeting as published in the October *Hillholder* was made, seconded, and approved by all members present.
- We recognized October birthdays and anniversaries, and recalled those members we want to keep in our thoughts and prayers.
- Jim Nichols circulated a photo album that included pictures of the car we adopted at the Studebaker Museum. The signage indicating our sponsorship in memory of Tom Elliott is in place. The album also included pictures from the Michiana Chapter's meeting at the Studebaker proving grounds, and some shots of the Studebaker foundry demolition.

- We circulated the obituary for Peggy Soderberg, Assistant Director of the Studebaker Museum, who passed away September 18.
- Wayne Lee reports that the Northeast Florida chapter is planning to host the 2012 Florida State Meet.
- Charlotte Delli presented the Treasurer's Report; a copy will be in *The Hillholder*. We are just above the chapter's desired \$5,000 minimum account balance, so we will not be looking for any further charitable giving opportunities for the time being.
- Our next meeting will be Saturday November 5th, starting at 1 PM. We will meet in Waleska to start out; from there we will do some touring to our final "mystery" destination. Charlotte hinted the restaurant is near a national historic site and has great food. More information and directions will be in *The Hillholder*.
- Bill Delli reports that a couple recently joined the chapter, bringing our membership to 67 households.
- We reminded members that officer nominations are still open for **all** offices. We still do not have any nominees for secretary or membership secretary. The nomination form will continue running in *The Hillholder*.
- At the last meeting, we discussed the (10) Studebaker National Museum entry passes we received for our vehicle sponsorship. Motion was made, seconded, and approved to have a special drawing for these passes during the December meeting.


Dear NGSDC Members:



Call for Nominations – SDC Elections for 2012-2014 Term

It is time again to elect your SDC representatives. We are fortunate to have so many members who are committed to the success of our organization. The **Director** and **Coordinator** in each Zone and the **Regional Managers** are in a good position to recognize the leaders in their area and to encourage them to run for an office. SDC members may also nominate themselves or a current SDC member who lives in the Zone or Region to be represented. Be sure to confirm that the nominee is willing to perform the responsibilities of the office. Please refer to the job descriptions below. There are no special qualifications. And, if you are an incumbent and wish to continue serving, please nominate yourself.

Terms of office are for two years. Referring to the map, National Directors and Zone Coordinators in the “**non-shaded**” Zones are elected for terms **beginning in even numbered years** and the National Directors and Zone Coordinators in the “**shaded**” Zones are elected for terms **beginning in odd numbered years**. The corresponding Regional Managers for those Zones are elected in opposite years.

This year, nominations will be for **National Directors and Zone Coordinators** in the following Zones: **Atlantic Zone; Southeast Zone; Upper Mississippi Valley Zone; North Central Zone, Pacific Southwest Zone** and the **International Zone** for two year terms of office beginning April 15, 2012.

Nominations for **Regional Managers** will be for the following Regions: **Crossroads Zone, Northeast Zone, Pacific Can-Am Zone** and **South Central Zone** for two year terms of office beginning April 15, 2012.

Job Descriptions:

National Director

The Director represents the Zone at the National Board Meeting, the annual Membership Meeting and any special meetings called by the SDC President. As a member of the SDC Board of Directors, he or she has the final authority to act in all matters concerning his or her Zone, subject to the SDC by-laws. The Director communicates with and maintains a good working relationship with the Zone Coordinator and Regional Manager(s). This is a two year term, beginning April 15, 2012.

Zone Coordinator

This person is the liaison between the Regional Manager and the National Officers and reports directly to the SDC President. Quarterly, the Zone Coordinator receives a membership status report from the SDC Membership Secretary and distributes it to the Regional Manager and Chapter Presidents. In the absence of a National Director for the Zone, the Zone Coordinator shall fill the term of office vacated. If this occurs in the first year, a special election will be held to fill the vacancy for the second year. If the Zone Director is unable to attend the National Board Meeting, the Zone Coordinator will act as a proxy. The Zone Coordinator coordinates the scheduling of Zone Meets within his or her Zone and works with adjacent Zones

to avoid any conflict in dates. This is a two year term, beginning April 15, 2012.

Regional Manager


A Region may be a state, a part of a state or several states and the Regional Manager is the contact reference for club members in that Region. He or she receives a quarterly report of membership changes to assist in maintaining a current list of Chapters within the Region and supports the formation of new chapters. The Regional Manager encourages Chapters to hold regular meetings and publish a newsletter. He or she assists the Zone Coordinator in appointing committee members if needed, solving regional problems and other duties as requested. This is a two year term, beginning April 15, 2012.



Follow Hwy 140 through Canton (You will pass Cherokee High School and go about 1.5 miles until you turn left at the stoplight) and head for Waleska. This will take you into Waleska.


From the north:



This is a 99 page book based on the articles of the same name that appeared in *Turning Wheels* in the early 1990s and which won the SDC's Churchill Award for Best Article, Non-Paid.
